Victoria Peak is the highest peak in Hong Kong Island with an altitude of 554 meters and is considered a landmark of the island. It is the best spot to have a bird's eye view of the Victoria Harbor and the whole thriving island. Viewed from the peak, the scenes are different between day time and night.

Day 3 Monday, February 21, 2011 Hong Kong /Guangzhou



Sites to visit: Yuexiu Park, Ancestral Temple of Chen Family, Guangzhou Sun Yat-sen Memorial Hall, Pearl River night tour.

After breakfast, your local guide escorts you to the railway station to your next destination, Guangzhou. Travelling by luxurious train, you will enjoy the beautiful urban scenery of Hong Kong and agricultural landscapes in Guangdong province.



Upon arrival, you will be met by your local professional tour guide and transferred to the well selected Guangzhou Pearl River New Bank Hotel. You will take a short break and enjoy a Cantonese cuisine lunch and then take a tour of the city.

In the evening during dinner, you will hear about agriculture in this province from local key agriculture officers and experts. You will be able to further understand and explore business opportunities through this interaction.

After dinner you will travel the Pearl River. Her night scenes are quite magnificent.

Guangdong Province is especially known for its export oriented industry and electronics industries. Guangzhou is one of the coastal cities open to foreign investment in China. After breakfast, your local guide will escort you to the airport to your next destination, Haikou City, Hainan Province! Upon arrival your local guide will meet you and escort you to your hotel.

You will take a tour of this tropical city in the afternoon.

After a fresh sea food dinner in the evening, if the weather permits, you will enjoy a special performance, The Impression of Haiann.

The Impression of Haiann, is a totally different performance from the conventional form. The theater is nature itself. On the stage, only half of the performances are performed by humans, and the other half belongs to the mysterious nature. The chief designer and producer is Mr. Zhang Yi Mou, who was the chief designer for the 2008 Beijing Olympic opening and closing ceremony. It is a unique play. You can't see it anywhere else the world but here.

Hainan is different from other provinces. It is the second largest ocean island and the smallest land province in China. Its natural beauty has gained a good reputation among the visitors and has been widely known around the world. People call it "the Oriental Hawaii".

Haikou, the capital city of Hainan Province, is home to elegant seascapes and historical sites as well as dozens of newly-developed tourist regions and attractions.

Known as the first big tropical and oceanic theme park in China, the Tropical Ocean World in Haikou City, is a paradise to enjoy because of the breathtaking scenery of the tropical rain forests and wondrous views of ocean life.

The Wugong Temple (Five Officials Temple) was built in memory of five historical celebrities of the Tang and Song dynasties who lived within the Hainan Province. The temple is actually more like a building complex and is praised as 'the Number One Building in Hainan'

Day 5 Wednesday, February 23, 2011 Haikou/Sanya



After breakfast, your local tour guide will take you to the coach which will then take you to Sanya, the most southern, tropical city in China.

Sanya is a popular tourist attraction because of the crystal clear waters and white, sandy beaches. You will be travelling for about 4 hours which includes several stops at several villages along the route.

You will visit with some of the local, minority villages and observe some of the agriculture productions and converse with some local farmers. Your local agriculture tour guide will provide a description of local production practices and describe some minority culture traditions. These villages export products such as tropical fruits and green teas to Canada and other parts of China.



Handicrafts created by the local people are also available for purchase with very reasonable prices.

Here you will enjoy a quick lunch of fresh game including deer, mountain goat or sheep.

Upon arrival at Sanya, your local tour guide will escort you to the hotel where you will have some leisure time to enjoy the fresh, tropical air and glorious sunshine.

Sites to Visit: Nanshan Temple, the Miss World Contest, Sanya Dongtian Park, Yalong Bay Tianya Haijiao

After breakfast, your guide will take you to visit some very famous attractions. If you are lucky enough, you may experience monkeys retrieving coconuts from the top of the trees for your enjoyment! You can enjoy your fresh coconut with a refreshing pint of local beer and can join in the swimming and high diving activities at your leisure.

Nanshan Temple, occupying an area of 400 mu (66 acres), is nestled at the foot of Nanshan Mountain, an auspicious region famous for Chinese Buddhist culture with emphasis on longevity and happiness. In front of the Nanshan Temple is a terrace directly facing the South China Sea, from which visitors can admire the vast seascape and view the spectacular 108-meter (354-feet) high copper statue of the South China Sea Kwan-yin Bodhisattva.



Sanya Dongtian Park is located 40 kilometers away to the west of Sanya City of Hainan Province. It is the Taoist tourist attraction at the very end of China. For its dainty sea, mountain, rocks, and caves, it is crowned as the “Number One Scenic Spot in Hainan”. Enjoy the Sanya cultural show at the theater of the Miss World Contest Center in the evening.

Tianya Haijiao is located at the foot of the Maling Mountain in Sanya City of Hainan Province. In Tianya Haijiao, the sky and the sea merge into one. The mists and waves stretch far into the distance, dotted with sailing boats on the sea. The waving coconut palms and the bizarre stone make Tianya Haijiao poetic and picturesque.

Day 7 Friday, February 25, 2011 Sanya /Xi'an

After breakfast, your tour guide will escort you to the airport. You will take an hour and a half flight to your next destination, Xi'an.

Upon arrival at Xi'an, you will visit some of the most wondrous attractions in the world; the Terracotta Warriors and Horses, The Ancient City Walls and the Bell Tower.

Complete the day with a savory dumpling dinner and the Tang Dynasty show, both at Shaanxi Grand Opera Theatre.

The Dumpling Dinner: Dumpling or Jiaozi in Chinese is a traditional and popular food in China, especially in the north. At the dinner, nearly 20 varieties of dumplings which are steamed and stuffed with different delicious fillings such as vegetables, meats and seafood are served. These dumplings are not only tasty, but also characteristic with their colors, fragrance, style and culture meanings. The dumplings make the dinner so unique that you should not miss it when traveling in Xi'an.

Tang Dynasty Show: The Tang Dynasty (618-907 AD) was one of the most glorious dynasties in China's history. Xi'an was the capital during the Tang Dynasty and called Chang'an. The Tang Dynasty Show is a performance of Chang'an music and dances in Tang Dynasty style laid out according to various historical records and ancient arts and relics discovered in Xi'an. During the show, the musicians present the music with the Tang-Dynasty-style musical instruments and the dancers dance wearing a Tang-Dynasty-style robe with long, white, silk sleeves. You will certainly enjoy this national art that reflects the glory and richness of the Tang Dynasty era.

The incredible life-size Terracotta Warriors and Horses, one of the most significant archeological finds of the 20th century, were discovered in 1974 by local farmers digging a well. These 6,000 life-sized painted terracotta warriors and horses--individually sculpted from real-life models and arranged in battle formation, have been protecting the mausoleum of the first emperor in Chinese history—Emperor QinShihuang since 2,200 years ago.

The Ancient City Walls built during the 14th century on Tang dynasty foundations, date to the Ming Dynasty. The walls are the largest and best-preserved ancient fortress in the world. There is a gate in each of the four sides. The gate towers built over each gate look lofty and magnificent and form a tight defense engineering system.

Day 8 Saturday, February 26, 2011 Xi'an/Beijing



Today, you will visit the mythical birthplace for Chinese Agriculture –Yangling, nearby Xi'an Downtown. You will travel for about two hours to the rural county to see corn fields, a potato farm, cattle farms, piggeries, orchard farms and irrigation schemes. You will also visit the largest ostrich farm in Asia. Ostrich farming is very lucrative because every part of the ostrich is useful; the meat for food, the feathers and skin for clothing etc.

Technical meetings with local agricultural experts, officials, marketing experts and farmers will be arranged after each visit.

For lunch you will sample the many unique flavours of Chinese cuisine at the famous ecological restaurant. The menu features much of the locally grown produce. The comfortable atmosphere is created by a small, serene water fall, bamboo trees and exotic, local flowers.

After your trip in the afternoon, your tour guide and private vehicle will meet you and escort you to The Xi'an Xianyang International Airport for your flight to your next destination -- Beijing. Upon your arrival in Beijing, China's capital, your personal guide will meet you and escort you to your hotel.

Yangling is the mythical birthplace of Chinese agriculture. Legend has it that one Hou Ji began to teach people in the area how to farm, starting a revolution that wound up creating Chinese civilization. Yangling is rich in scientific research and educational resources as two universities and some research institutes are located here and more than 5,000 achievements have been reached. Yangling is now the cradle of China's agricultural science and technology development and a significant base for the demonstration of agricultural industries.

Day 9 Sunday, February 27, 2011 Beijing



After breakfast, your tour includes the Imperial City of Beijing. The tour offers a stroll in Tiananmen Square, Forbidden City, the complex of the Imperial Palace and the Great Wall of China.

To round off a memorable start to your tour, we will arrange the Beijing specialty Duck Dinner at a famous restaurant. Officials from the Chinese government and Canadian embassy, Canadian business representatives in China, in addition to China dairy industrial representatives will be invited to welcoming dinner in Beijing.

Peking Roast Duck is prepared in several steps: first the ducks are rubbed with spices, salt and sugar, and then hung in the air for some time. A succulent aroma tempts the palate as the ducks are then roasted in an oven, or hung over the fire until golden brown and dripping with rich juices.

The Imperial Palace was home to the Chinese Emperors for over 500 years, and is sited on 72 hectares of land with 9,000 rooms covering a floor space of 150,000 square meters. Grand halls and courts gradually give way to the more intimate domestic quarters, giving an insight into the pampered isolation of the emperors.

The Great Wall of China was first built in the Warring States period (475-221 BC) as a series of earthworks erected by individual kingdoms, as a defense against each other as well as from invasions from the north. Its main objective was to keep out Genghis Khan and the Mongolian hordes. This proved only partially successful. The present day wall was left from the Ming dynasty and it represents one of the wonders of the world.

Day 11

Tuesday, March 1, 2011

Beijing/Yancheng



After breakfast, the rest of the morning is free to spend at your leisure. In the afternoon you will be escorted to the airport for your flight to Yancheng city, Jiangsu province.

Yancheng is a sea-level city in northeastern Jiangsu province, People's Republic of China. The city with the largest jurisdiction area in Jiangsu, Yancheng borders Lianyungang to the north, Huai'an to the west, Yangzhou and Taizhou to the southwest, Nantong to the south, and looks out to the Yellow Sea to the east. Yancheng has a history of 2,100 years since the first canton was founded here in Han Dynasty at year 119 BC. It was named for the salt reserves in rivers around the area, its name literally meaning "Salt City". Yancheng was in the limelight during the Chinese Civil War from the 1930s to 1940s. The New Fourth Army (N4A) led by the Communist Party of China was reestablished in Yancheng after being ambushed and battered by the enemy. After the revival, the N4A played a very important role in the war and finally the foundation of the People's Republic of China. Many monuments in honor of N4A heroes can still be found

around Yancheng.

Day 12 Wednesday, March 2, 2011 Yancheng



This morning you will meet with agriculture government officials of the city. They will provide some interesting facts and information about local Chinese agriculture.

Then you will travel for an hour and visit one of the most majestic dairy farms in China which incorporates a new precision operating system. This farms houses more than 10,000 dairy cattle.

From here you will travel to a state owned piggery farm, which houses approx. half a million pigs. You will also tour the local aqua-culture production farms and view the fish, lobster and crab ponds.

You will have lunch at the local restaurant featuring fresh sea-food caught from the ponds.

After lunch you will visit the Dafeng Elk Nature Reserve in the ancient town of Tongli.

In the evening you may be invited to share dinner with the mayor of the city.

Dafeng Elk nature reserve is located in the central part of China's Yellow Sea, with a wetlands area of 7.8 million hectares. Here are the original wetlands of Pacific ancient habitat protection. This piece of paradise in the East Asia is very rich in biodiversity with over 500 species of sea plants. You may also be lucky enough to spot a Red Crowned Chinese Crane or two.

Yanchen is practically in Shanghai's backyard and provides agri-food supplies for the Shanghai. The land mass used for dairy and beef farming as well as horses continues to expand in Yanchen.

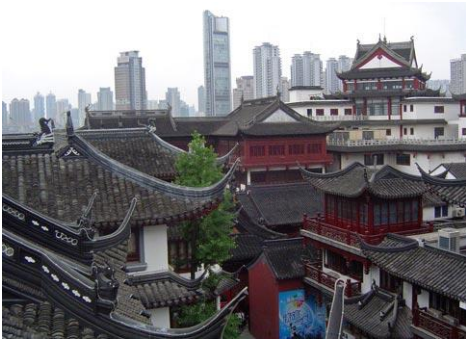

Enjoy a wonderful Portman Acrobatic Show at the Shanghai Centre Theatre tonight.

While visiting the Yuyuan Garden, you should not miss the Rhinoceros Horn Libation Cup (a cup made of rhinoceros horn). With a height of 11 centimeters, the cup has an oval opening, which is about 16 centimeters long and 12 centimeters wide. On the surface of the cup, there is a beautiful, carved picture of a parrot and some plum trees. Chinese Rhinoceros Horn

Libation Cup has a long history which can be traced back to the Shang Dynasty. In addition, it enjoys equal reputation as the Ivory Carvings.

The Bund is situated along the western bank of the Huangpu River. The Bund is thought to be the symbol of the city. It is a 4 kilometer-long waterfront. The Bund, retaining an air of the past, is a glimpse of the city's roaring past. 52 buildings of different architectural styles such as Baroque, Gothic, Romanesque, Chinese and Renaissance are erected on the Bund. Therefore, it is also called "The Museum of International Architecture". The European buildings contrast finely with skyscrapers on the east bank of the Huangpu River.

Portman Acrobatic Show: Chinese Acrobatics is one of the oldest performing arts with its history tracing back to Neolithic times. During its development in history, it has been absorbing plentiful merits from the opera, dance and Chinese Kungfu, and formed its own artistic features. At the Portman Acrobatic Show, in a very typical Shanghai setting and atmosphere, you will enjoy many breathtaking and stunning programs, such as Calvaria Skills, Silk Suspending, Hoop Diving and so on, performed by very skilful performers. You will truly have an unforgettable experience!
